Dear Mr. Dodaro:

We write to follow-up on previous Government Accountability Office (GAO) reports relating to the Nuclear Regulatory Commission's (NRC) budget development, financial management, fee-setting process, and budget execution.

Recent GAO reports requested by the Senate Environment and Public Works Committee and House Energy and Commerce Committee identified numerous inconsistencies, a lack of transparency, and inadequate information in NRC's budget and financial management systems and processes. Those GAO reports recommended action to improve NRC's fee-setting process,<sup>1</sup> fee-billing process,<sup>2</sup> budget justification documentation,<sup>3</sup> and workforce planning,<sup>4</sup> among others.

In response to GAO findings and as part of NRC's ongoing efforts to increase organizational management, NRC initiated activities to address organizational deficiencies. For example, NRC's Fees Transformation Initiative identified several changes the agency could make to improve its fee-setting process. Additionally, starting with its budget request for fiscal year 2018, NRC included the agency's actual obligations for prior years to increase transparency on how the agency spends its appropriations.

While NRC has launched some initiatives, it is unclear the extent to which NRC has completed these efforts and the extent to which these actions have resulted in the anticipated process improvements. To assist our assessment of NRC's recent initiatives, we ask you to

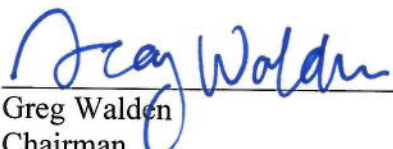

1. To what extent has NRC implemented all the planned changes to its planning, budgeting, and financial management activities in response to internal initiatives and GAO recommendations?
2. How is the NRC assessing the results achieved from implementing changes to its planning, budgeting, and financial management activities?
3. How do the results compare with NRC's expectations?
4. How have the initiatives impacted NRC licensees and applicants?
5. What additional actions, if any, could NRC take to achieve the goals identified in its internal initiatives for its planning, budgeting, and financial management activities?

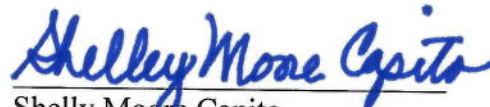
